

End of the Year Project Overview Options

Option One: Continue with the topic we are one—persuasion—and turn your persuasive essay into a convincing, power point/ Prezi/ Keynote led speech. Include visuals and be sure to include the three techniques of persuasion (pathos, logos, and ethos). You will be graded on your professional presentation and your speaking techniques. You must include at least ten slides and have your speech last 5-7 minutes. Remember to include a hook slide (to grab your audience’s attention), your thesis, your three major reasons, a rebuttal, and your call to action.

Option Two: Learn about 10 styles of poetry. Find a poem of each and write about its significance to you and/or meaning (4+ sentences), something about the author (4+ sentences), and then write ten original poems of your own with these styles. Include amazing illustrations. You will be graded on your ability to analyze poetry and create illustrations or well-pleasingly arranged computer pictures. Please type this assignment.

Option Three: Create a two-round cumulative Jeopardy review of all topics covered this year, from August forward (including writing techniques, literature, etc.). You will be graded on the layout of your game, and on the level of difficulty of questions. You must have 50 questions.

Option Four: Complete a novel or short story project, totaling in 100 points (LAD students, your project for LAD *can count* as long as it is quality, and *as long as* you do not waste class time during project work time, and choose that time to get caught up on other assignments). Point values for project pieces can be found on my website under May 9th/10th.

Options Five: Write another researched persuasive essay, with the same requirements as the one required by all originally.

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
